

The Louise B. Raggio Award (formerly the MA'AT Justice Awared)

Louise Ballerstedt Raggio was a lawyer who was the first woman lawyer in almost everything she did from being an assistant district attorney to being the lawyer who oversaw creation of the Texas Family Code to being named the first voting emeritus council member of the Women and the Law Section.

The Ma'at Justice Award was established in 1995 to recognize and celebrate individual attorneys or an association of attorneys who have contributed to the furtherance of justice in our society.
